

SPRAYING – ADJACENT ORCHARDS

Context

The Principal shall have an awareness of adjacent orchards that have a potential to use pesticides or herbicides on their property.

These procedures are intended to ensure safety for students during orchard spray periods.

Procedures

- The Principal has the responsibility to contact the orchardist to express concerns of spraying and to build a relationship to ensure that safe procedures are adhered to for the safety of staff and students.
- 2. The Principal and orchardist to agree on spraying applications during core school hours (i.e., 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.) and contact school authorities at least one day prior to spraying during school hours.
- 3. The Principal, Vice-Principal, or designate has the responsibility to ensure that adequate safety precautions are followed:
 - 3.1. Irrigating playing fields next to orchards right after spray has been applied to act as a physical barrier for spray residue if drift has occurred.
 - 3.2. Making students aware of no entry into the irrigated area or zone.
 - 3.3. Ensuring precautions relating to washing prior to lunch will be followed.
 - 3.4. Requiring windows in the school to be closed if there is any danger of drift.
 - 3.5. Cautioning students not to walk through orchards going to or from school.
- 4. The Principal, Vice-Principal, or designate may direct concerns regarding these procedures to the manager of the BC Fruit Growers Association at 250-762-5226.
- 5. For pesticide spraying concerns for schools that border residential agriculture properties within the City of Kelowna, contact the City of Kelowna Development Services at 250-469-8632.
